## "REDEEM THE TIME!"

It was during my recent days of fasting and prayer that I heard the whisper of the Holy Spirit in my heart say, "**Redeem the time!**" As I waited continuously in the presence of God, a powerful timely message unfolded. I started seeing things in the Scriptures in a new light.

The Apostle Paul admonishes the saints at Ephesus with these words: "*See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is*" (Ephesians 5:15-17). The Apostle Paul also wrote to the Colossians: "*Walk in wisdom toward those who are outside, redeeming the time. Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one*" (Colossians 4:5-6).

In the above passages the Apostle Paul admonish the saints with the following:

- You are wasting your time and not redeeming it when you do not know what is God's will concerning you!
- You are wasting your time and not redeeming it when you do not conduct yourself with the grace of God among those in the world who desperately need God!

What a powerful passage! In other words, a true believer who walks in the wisdom of God's truth will surely redeem their time by walking in the presence of God and living by the principles of God's word. That believer though subjected at times to the persuasions of the enemy will surely overcome his ploys, tricks and distractions. They will be truly focused on receiving all that God has promised

them in His holy word and be a true blessing to communicate the will of our Living God to those who look up to them in the world.

There are two instances in the Bible both connected with righteous leaders where

God stopped time to provide victory in their situations.

- When all the kings of the Amorites came against Gibeon, Joshua fought against the Amorites. "*Then Joshua spoke to the LORD in the day when the LORD delivered up the Amorites before the children of Israel, and he said in the sight of Israel: 'Sun, stand still over Gibeon; and Moon, in the Valley of Aijalon.' So the sun stood still, and the moon stopped, till the people had revenge upon their enemies... So the sun stood still in the midst of heaven, and did not hasten to go down for about a whole day. And there has been no day like that, before it or after it, that the LORD heeded the voice of a man; for the LORD fought for Israel*" (Joshua 10:12-14).
- King Hezekiah was told by the Prophet Isaiah to set his house in order for he would die within days. The king cried out to the Lord reminding God of his righteousness and truth. God sent the same prophet back to pronounce healing from his tumor and gave him a promise of an extended life of 15 years to King Hezekiah. As a sign Hezekiah asked for the shadow of the sundial to go backward by ten degrees: "*And Hezekiah answered, 'It is an easy thing for the shadow to go down ten degrees; no, but let the shadow go backward ten degrees.'* So Isaiah the prophet cried out to the LORD, and He brought the shadow ten degrees backward, by which it had gone down on the sundial of Ahaz" (II Kings 20:10-11).

Time, as we know it, is in God's control. But in both examples above, there is this indication that a Sovereign God listens to the cry of the righteous and grants them the privilege of redeeming that which is precious by managing their time!

There is a spiritual significance of redeeming the time by those who walked with God in the Bible. I see numerous examples that could have been otherwise victimized by their age, circumstances, natural disasters, etc. but were granted victory over their circumstances by which they redeemed their time while others around them lost it.

### EXAMPLES OF THE WISE WHO REDEEMED THEIR TIME!

Let us consider the following godly examples:

- 1) **Abraham** – Genesis 18:14; Romans 4:20-22; Hebrews 11:8-12. Abraham gained time from God to not let go of the miracle he would have had some decades earlier! He and Sarah had their miracle at last – Isaac! **In my opinion, as Abraham and Sarah progressed forward in their journey of obedience with God Almighty ("El-Shaddai"), their body clocks regressed backward in ageless vitality, strength and fruitfulness to become the proud parents of Isaac!** The lesson is that the time you have invested in God through your obedience is the time you have gained and not lost!
- 2) **Jacob** – Genesis 32:24-30; 31:52; 33:3-4. 20 years had passed before God fulfilled what He had spoken earlier to Jacob (Genesis 28:13-15). Jacob redeemed himself from the animosity of Laban and from a 20 year old hatred between him and his older brother Esau. Jacob also fathered Joseph who was born out of a revival cry from Rachel (Genesis 30:1, 22).
- 3) **Joseph** – Genesis 37:5-7; 39:2-5; 39:21-23; 41:14,34,39-44; Psalm 105:17-22. Egypt could have lost 7 years to famine but for Joseph with his wise counsel that redeemed those 7 years. It was not easy for Joseph to undergo a severe testing by the hand of God before he was ushered into his prominence: "**Until the time that the word came: the WORD of the Lord tried him**" (Psalm 105:19).
- 4) **The Widow of the Man who served Elisha** – II Kings 4:1-7. The widow's husband served the prophet all his life leaving nothing to his posterity. All those years of service to the prophet were years redeemed by his widow when she approached Elisha for his counsel and guidance. By the prophet's counsel and the widow's obedience, a little cruise of oil was multiplied to fill all the vessels she had borrowed from her neighbors, her

debt was paid in full and she enjoyed her later years with her two sons. The years of investment to a true vessel of honor helps you gain and not lose your reward (Matthew 10:41-42).

#### 5) **The Shunammite Woman** –

II Kings 8:1-6. The Shunammite woman who was gracious to the prophet Elisha received the benefits of honoring a man of God. She was warned by the prophet of the coming famine and took his advice and left her homeland for 7 years. Upon her return she found that her field and her home were taken over by her government. She appealed to her King who at the same time was reviewing the archives of all the miracles of Elisha's ministry when he was alive. It so happened that when the King heard about the Shunammite woman and the miracle restoration of her son's life from death she had received by the hand of the Prophet Elisha the King ordered: ***“Restore all that was hers, and all the fruits of the field since the day that she left the land, even until now” (II Kings 8:6).*** A retroactive blessing and a gain are in store to all those who heed the warning by the Spirit of God.

#### 6) **King Hezekiah** – II Kings 20:1-11.

The Prophet Isaiah was commissioned by God to speak to the King Hezekiah to set his house in order and that he would die in days. The King cried out to God reminding Him of his truth and righteousness. God's heart softened and He sent back the same prophet to speak to Hezekiah the second time. Hezekiah was redeemed from death and was given **15 more years!** II Kings 20:3 – Walking before God in truth and with a perfect heart helps you receive God's favor for an extended life!

#### 7) **God's People with True Unity and Repentance** – Joel 2:12-32.

The nation of Israel sinned against God and God took away their prosperity and joy with His army of cankerworms, palmerworms, caterpillars and locusts. God was also gracious to give them the solution for His restoration: *“Now, therefore, says the LORD, Turn to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning. So rend your heart, and not your garments; return to the LORD your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness; and He relents from doing harm” (Joel 2:12-13).* ***“And I will restore to you the years that the locust has eaten, the cankerworm, and the caterpillar, and the palmerworm, my great army which I sent among you” (2:25).*** Repentance is the key to redeeming what you have lost over the years. Note this – Repentance is more than merely saying that you are sorry and going back to doing the same thing!

## EXAMPLES OF THE THOSE WHO WASTED THEIR TIME!

Here are some sad examples of those who lost their opportunities and their time:

1) **Esau** – Genesis 25:31-34; 27:38-41; Hebrews 12:16-17. Esau sold more than his birthright for a morsel of food. He was a habitual fornicator and a profane person. His time of repentance had passed from him and his inheritance was lost even though he sought it with tears.

2) **Israel** – Deuteronomy 1:2; Numbers 14:29-34. A 11-day journey from Egypt to the Promised Land in obedience to God was stretched out to a 40 years of wandering at the end of which the adults were not allowed to enter! Every day of doubting added a year of wandering in the wilderness! The exception was Caleb who had faithfully followed God for 45 years. Here are Caleb's own words: *“As yet I am as strong this day as on the day that Moses sent me; just as my strength was then, so now is my strength for war, both for going out and for coming in” (Joshua 14:11).* Do you think Caleb spent all his strength with a wandering crowd for 40 years? Absolutely not! **While Israel was wandering over 40 years and losing their lives in the desert, Caleb retained his strength and redeemed his inheritance from the Lord! The time you spend following God is the time you have gained to redeem your inheritance!**

3) **Samson** – Judges 16:20-21, 31. Samson fell into weakness being enticed and seduced by Delilah. Samson judged Israel 20 years and could have continued on had he not lost valuable time, position, status, mobility and his vision. The enemy knows who among the leaders of God can be enticed and will try hard to destroy them!

4) **David** – II Samuel 11:1-2. David's unique calling was to fight the Lord's battles (I Samuel 13:14; 18:17; 25:28) against God's enemies with a heart that loved God. David took a break from fighting the Lord's battles and stayed back while his roving eyes lusted after Bath-sheba. The consequence of that sin led to murder, loss of lives (Tamar, Amnon, Absalom) and years of shame (II Samuel 13:23; 38). Take wisdom from the Apostle Paul's example: *“But none of these things move me; nor do I count my life dear to myself, so that I may finish my race with joy, and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God” (Acts 20:24).* God's calling and purpose are bigger than your life! A purposeless life wastes time, precious time!

5) **Zedekiah** – God in His mercy granted King Zedekiah a true voice of reason and prophetic counsel through the Prophet Jeremiah. King Zedekiah even asked for Jeremiah's counsel on God's matters several times, *“inquire for us (Jeremiah 21:2);” “Pray now unto us, our God, for us (Jeremiah 37:2);” “Is there any word from the Lord (Jeremiah 37:17)?” “Hide nothing from me (Jeremiah 38:14).* Unfortunately the prophet did not give the counsel that pleased King Zedekiah. Zedekiah lost valuable time and met with his tragic end: *“Then the king of Babylon killed the sons of Zedekiah before his eyes. And he killed all the princes of Judah in Riblah. He also put out the eyes of Zedekiah; and the king of Babylon bound him in bronze fetters, took him to Babylon, and put him in prison till the day of his death” (Jeremiah 52:10-11).*

6) **A Blind Jerusalem** – Jesus cried out as He overlooked Jerusalem: *“O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the one who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, but you were not willing! See! Your house is left to you desolate; and assuredly, I say to you, you shall not see Me until the time comes when you say, ‘Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!’” (Luke 13:34-35).* Judgment was unavoidable because in Jesus' words, *“You do not know the time of your visitation” (Luke 19:44).*

## WHAT MUST YOU DO TO REDEEM YOUR TIME?

The Bible gives us various examples and situations as to how we must redeem the time. Here are some of the valuable lessons from the Scriptures:

1) **A Changed Attitude:** Many of us live in a time when we have a plentiful supply of all the “things” we need to live a comfortable life. With a glut of “stuff” occupying our homes and cluttering our lifestyle, when we lose something precious, we simply rush to replace it with something else. The result is that there is a lack of value given to human life, relationships, friendships and all that God's word calls “special and vital” to our existence. This is the difference in our modern-day culture than the one we find in the Bible. **A change of attitude is vitally required with a firm determination to not lose that God calls precious!**

The Parables of the lost sheep, lost coin and the lost son (Luke 15:3-7; 8-10; 11-32) tell us the story of that which is precious and valuable in God's sight! The good shepherd is not happy with the 99 in the fold but grieves for the one that is lost and suffering somewhere. He then goes after the lost

sheep, recovers it and brings in into the fold to join with the 99.

The woman who lost one of the 10 coins lost part of her inheritance. She did not accept the loss but started sweeping the house with diligence to recover her valuable inheritance.

The lost son took his part of the inheritance from his father and left. He could have thought that his trials and tribulations caused by the younger son had come to an end but instead, he waited with a heart of compassion for his lost son to come back. The lost son did return with a heart of repentance!

Jesus Himself kept His relationship with His Heavenly Father, His disciples and was very conscious of His time (John 6:39; John 18:9; John 2:4; John 7:6; Matthew 26:2,45). **You must fight aggressively to keep that which God has given you. Remember...all good things come from God:** *“Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning” (James 1:17).*

**2) Stop Robbing Yourself:** Time that you have not spent with God and His word is the time you have robbed from yourself and you are soon heading toward a spiritual delinquency. Follow the perfect example of Jesus in spending time with the Heavenly Father – Luke 9:18; Luke 11:1; Matthew 14:23; Luke 22:44; Luke 5:16; Luke 6:12; Mark 1:35; Luke 9:28-29; Matthew 26:36, 42, 44; Hebrews 5:7. Jesus protected what was given to Him by His Heavenly Father by His unbroken communion and fellowship with God. *“My son, give attention to my words; incline your ear to my sayings. Do not let them depart from your eyes; keep them in the midst of your heart; for they are life to those who find them, and health to all their flesh. **Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life**” (Proverbs 4:20-23).*

**3) Listen and Follow Instructions – We Hardly do!** Jesus warned us of a dullness syndrome: *“For the hearts of this people have grown dull. Their ears are hard of hearing, and their eyes they have closed, lest they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears, lest they should understand with their hearts and turn, so that I should heal them” (Matthew 13:15).*

Just as the Bible warns us of this “dullness syndrome” by those examples in the Old Testament, we, in the last days, face the danger of falling into the same trap. There is a fast growing dangerous attitude in our modern society – we go to the classrooms with the thought that we know more than our teachers; we go the experts (such as doctors and other professionals) but do not heed their advice for our good; sadly, we go to churches not willing to receive from our shepherds that God has appointed over

us to watch for our souls. Modernism has corrupted us with a capitalistic consumer mentality which causes us to not accept the truth but rather fight it with a spirit of independence. The result is a loss of time and ignorance of the truth which sets one free. We must open our hearts every day to learn and obey the voice of the Spirit and refuse to give into a spirit of compromise and resistance to God’s will. The more we learn and obey the more we become sensitive to the timing of God!

**4) Run from the place of Enticement and Contamination:** Samson was enticed and lost his anointing and precious time. Instead, he lost his eyes, his mobility, his status and his place as a chosen leader among God’s people and became a slave and servant to his captors.

David did not run from his place of temptation. As a result he lost precious lives and years to defeat, humiliation and despair. **You must live with a sense of vulnerability and yet, draw strength from God by leaning your entire personality upon Him.**

Unlike Samson and David, Joseph ran from the place of his temptation, Genesis 39:12. Though Joseph ran away from a possible prosperous position, God preserved him for a promotion that was yet bigger than that he could have ever imagined! A higher honor awaits those who give up their “comfort zones” in order to fulfill the will of God. Admit your vulnerabilities to God and God will be faithful to protect and deliver you from all evil: *“Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall. No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it” (I Corinthians 10:12-13).*

**5) Respect your Mentors and Receive from them:** The Bible is full of examples of mentors leading their precious loved ones to their destinies – Moses and Joshua; Samuel and David; Elijah and Elisha; Naomi and Ruth; Mordecai and Esther; Jesus and His Disciples.

The word declares the burden that shepherds carry within themselves. God requires them to give an account of their sheep: *“Obey those who rule over you, and be submissive, for they watch out for your souls, as those who must give account. Let them do so with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you” (Hebrews 13:17).* Do not fail to submit to those true mentors that you have known in your spirit to be responsible for you and learn from them to avoid any loss of valuable time: *“And we urge you, brethren, to recognize those who labor among you, and are over you in the Lord and admonish you” (I Thessalonians 5:12).*

**6) Invest in God, His People and His Kingdom:** You must learn how to invest in the heart of God to redeem your time. **Invest your time with God and God will grant you His time.** A righteous King Hezekiah appealed for God’s mercy with his righteousness and truth and God spared his life from death for another 15 years; an obedient shepherd, Joshua, who whole-heartedly followed God, vanquished God’s enemies in a battle at Gibeon by the additional time sanctioned by God!

Invest in God’s desires for you and God will shower you with His favor! Listen to the words of Jesus in the New Testament: *“... I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in; I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me.” Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, ‘Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?’ And the King will answer and say to them, ‘Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me’” (Matthew 25:35-40). **Invest in the heart of God and you are sure to receive your reward – God’s extended time!***

**7) Spend Time in Diligent Prayer to Redeem What is Yours:** King David prayed with a heart of repentance for seven days for his child that was born out of wedlock and lay dying. The time of repentance by David was time well spent before God. God promoted the next child, Solomon, to the throne of David: *“Then David comforted Bathsheba his wife...so she bore a son, and he called his name Solomon. Now the LORD loved him, and He sent word by the hand of Nathan the prophet: So he called his name Jedidiah, because of the LORD” (II Samuel 12:24-25).*

Diligent prayer is the key to producing what God has promised you. Without it you will be waiting a long time without seeing any results! The example is that of Elijah who heard from the Lord: *“Go, present yourself to Ahab, and I will send rain on the earth” (I Kings 18:1).* He then bowed to the ground and started his travelling prayer seven times at the end of which the rain came: *“Then it came to pass the seventh time, that he said, ‘There is a cloud, as small as a man’s hand, rising out of the sea!’ So he said, ‘Go up, say to Ahab, ‘Prepare your chariot, and go down before the rain stops you’” (I Kings 18:44).*

Jesus never stopped praying and communicating with His Father: *“(Jesus) who, in the days of His flesh, when He had offered up prayers and supplications, with vehement cries and tears to Him who was able to save Him from death,*

### 8) **Get Rid of the Parasites in Your**

**Life:** There are three precious seeds of God that grow inside of every believer – God’s Faith, God’s Grace and God’s Love!

Faith grows with obedience; grace is multiplied by humility; and love grows by the constant sharing of it! Faith moves the mountains, grace leads you to your destination and love keeps you free from contamination. We need all three to grow in us so that we can operate with the God-given freedom to accomplish and reproduce God’s Son, Jesus Christ, in our life.

Let me caution you of three powerful parasites that will hamper the growth of faith, grace and love. They are disobedience, pride and unforgiveness.

The Bible warns us to stay from our old lifestyle of disobedience that stunts the growth of faith: *“And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins, in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience, among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others” (Ephesians 2:1-3).*

Humility increases grace which empowers you with God-given ability to reach your goals. However, pride and arrogance frustrate the grace of God: *“Likewise you younger people, submit yourselves to your elders. Yes, all of you be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility, for ‘God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble.’ Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time” (1 Peter 5:5-6).*

Causing and holding unforgiveness will keep you from receiving God’s love and allowing it to flow through you as His conduit. In the spiritual sense, unforgiveness clogs up your arteries and veins and prevents the blood flow causing paralysis to your spiritual growth. Remember the word of Jesus: *“And whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him, that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your trespasses. But if you do not forgive, neither will your Father in heaven forgive your trespasses” (Mark 11:25-26).*

**If you give place to these parasites, your time will be wasted, your fruits will diminish, your accomplishments will be on hold and chances are that you will never arrive at the position God has for you. Please take caution and remove all signs of disobedience, pride and unforgiveness from your life. They are costing you valuable time and are hampering your growth with God!**

Dearly Beloved, I have poured out my heart of passion and desire though this article with a sense of not preaching to you but rather yearning to practice everything I have just communicated to you. This is a message for me, you and the entire body of God’s people to walk in holiness and in victory. Our victory is in redeeming the time Satan has stolen from us by returning to God fully and passionately. It takes a heart of diligence to know the times that we are living in and to not waste it with sin, iniquity, disobedience, arrogance and rebellion. Let us purpose in our hearts to know God’s perfect will through our constant obedience and communication with Jesus Christ our Lord!

Please pray with me: **“Heavenly Father, my times are in Your hand. I am so sorry for all the times I have wasted in not knowing Your will. Please forgive me as I turn to You for Your help, mercy and grace. Father, I realize fully that my life is precious in Your hands and the purpose of my existence is to communicate to a lost world that God is alive in me and is moving through me. Father, I pray that You will strengthen me and fill me with Your wisdom through Your word to know Your heart. Help me to avoid the losses that I have suffered over the years and redeem the years ahead of me to live in peace and in harmony with You and with those whom You have so graciously entrusted to my care. I abide in Your presence and for Your glory, honor and praise. In Jesus’ Name, Amen! Amen!!”**

We at Bethel give thanks to God for His matchless mercies that are new every morning. There are several milestones we have crossed this year. Here are some highlights of this year:



I also pray that you redeem the time that the devil had stolen from you and your loved ones.
- 3) **Miracle Reports:** Last year, there was a word of knowledge of a brother in the Lord who was concerned about a spot in the liver that was cancerous. We prayed with that precious brother in August 2009. Our dear brother was diagnosed with the terminal stage of Melanoma type of cancer that had spread to the liver. It was our prayer that God would intervene before this year's retreat in September 2010. Thank God for His intervention! Our dear brother and his family were rejoicing as they brought forth a victory report at the retreat.
- 4) **A Touch of Revival:** One of the unforgettable scenes of the recent retreat and in our ministries at several places in the northeast is the touch of God's glory upon little children. Hema and I witnessed the transforming power of the Holy Spirit upon children aged 5 through 11 years when they began to weep under the move of God. Whole audiences were impacted once the Spirit of God touched the young children. We pray that God will continue to transform all of our lives and the lives of our dear children!
